Dear OneJax FRIENDS & SUPPORTERS,

On July 1, 2024 OneJax celebrated its first full year as an independent nonprofit agency since separating from the University of North Florida. It was a year that tested our resolve and commitment to provide high quality programming despite several transitions.

When our CEO left to take a new position in October of 2023, board member Patricia (Patti) McElroy, President of the VyStar Foundation, stepped up to steer the ship. We remain grateful to Patti for all of the time and attention she devoted to OneJax during those few months.

Our new CEO, Elizabeth Andersen, hit the ground running when she started on February 5. She is currently guiding OneJax through a strategic planning process that will chart our path for the next three years. We are, indeed, reimagining OneJax to build upon our 54-year legacy of promoting respect and understanding among all people in Jacksonville.

Some highlights of the year:

- Our Sandy Miller OneYouth Programs delivered assorted leadership sessions to 1,183 middle and high school students. They learned more about themselves by learning more about each other.
- Adult programming and events touched more than 1,313 people through the Community Suppers program, the Interfaith Gratitude Service and special forums.
- The Humanitarian Awards event drew about 650 people and raised more money for our general operations than ever before in our history.

What does a reimagined OneJax look like?

- More opportunities for direct community engagement—to talk and listen to one another—especially during this charged election season.
- Programs on re-learning how to agree to disagree, without the critical judgements and extremes that separate people, including a new and improved model for the community suppers called *"Breaking Bread & Barriers—A Civil Discourse Community Supper."*
- Greater collaboration with other nonprofits and city agencies on programs of mutual interest and value to the community.
- Convenings for faith leaders across the community to come together for fellowship and social impact.

We want to deliver the impact you believe we can make when we all work together to eliminate hate and become a more welcoming community where everyone belongs.
