Through a sequence of engaging sessions, we'll invite participants to share thoughtful, respectful conversations about how technology, media, and artificial intelligence are shaping our lives and our community:

Session 1-Filtered Truths — Social Media, Algorithms, and the Public Square Date: September 2025

In a world where algorithms shape what we see, hear, and believe, how can we remain grounded in truth and stay connected to one another? Join us for a thought-provoking evening exploring the power and pitfalls of social media. From echo chambers to viral misinformation, we'll unpack how digital platforms influence our communities and challenge our civic engagement. Come ready to listen, share, and reimagine what responsible digital citizenship looks like. Whether you're a daily poster or a quiet scroller, your perspective matters.

Session 2: Whose News? Media, Mistrust, and the Search for Truth Date: January 2026

Where do you turn for truth—and why does it matter? In today's crowded media landscape, facts and opinions often blur, and trust in traditional journalism is on shaky ground. This session delves into how people obtain their news—from major outlets to faith-based sources—and what that means for community understanding and dialogue. Together, we'll explore how to build media literacy, navigate bias, and bridge divides in a world where headlines can both inform and inflame. Join neighbors from across Jacksonville for a timely conversation on being informed, not inflamed.



Session 3: Al & Authenticity — What's Real and What's Not Date: May 2026

Can you trust what you see anymore? As artificial intelligence becomes a bigger part of everyday life—from deepfakes to auto-generated content—we're all grappling with what's real and what's not. This session invites you to join a conversation about the impact of AI on truth, trust, and the future of human connection. Hear from experts, share your thoughts, and discover how we can navigate this rapidly evolving digital landscape together. Whether you're tech-savvy or just curious, this is your chance to help shape a future grounded in shared values and ethical choices.
